- a. Freshman Seminars (new courses):
  - i. CHEM 1904 Freshman seminar: My Other Car is a Bicycle
- b. New Course: CHEM 2912 Career Options for Chemists
- c. New Course: CSE 1516 PLTW: Computer Science Principles (it's for college credit of HS course)
- d. New Course: ESCI 1201 Intro. Earth Sciences Lab (it's just a placeholder)
- e. New Course: ESCI 1205 Geology and Cinema Lab Program (it's just a placeholder)
- f. New Course: ESCI 5805 Practical Skills for Professional Geoscientists
- g. New Courses: PHYS 1221/2 -- Introductory Physics for Life Science Majors I/II (CBS versions of existing courses)

<u>CHEM 2912</u> – Questions about syllabus and options to retake for credit. Course will be discussed next meeting.

The following courses were approved:

- <u>ESCI 1201</u> Intro to Earth Sciences Lab: With this course, students get credit for taking just the lab for Intro to Earth Science course.
- <u>ESCI 1205</u> Geology and Cinema Lab Program: Has typically been just a lecture and discussion course, and now the department is considering adding a lab aspect to it.
- <u>ESCI 5805</u> Practical Skills for Professional Geoscientists: This course has been renamed to Standards and Practices for Professional Geoscientists.
- -The two Physics courses <u>PHYS 1201W</u> and <u>PHYS 1202W</u> will disappear; this is the last year offered. The new replacements are PHYS 1221 and PHYS 1222 (they will be offered next spring 2019). These courses will never be W courses. The department is dropping the writing aspect of the course. Each one will be four credits and they are equivalent to 1301 and 1302.

## **6.** Action Items (new course syllabi are on the website)

- a. New Course: BMEN 3151 Medical Device Practicum
- The purpose of BMEN 3151 is to reach proficiency in skills so students can feel more comfortable and when it comes the time, they can actually build a medical device.
- The course's projects work towards skills building, must not towards making a medical device because that is what students do in Senior Design.
- The next step in BMEN 3151 is to provide a bridge between the skills building and Senior Design and they are calling it a Practicum. It is a one-credit course and it is an extension for those students who already completed the introductory course, and wish to continue learning about those concepts and start building medical devices.
- This course will be offered on May sessions.
- BMEN 3151 Medical Device Practicum was approved by the committee.
- **b.** New Course: <u>HSCI 2346 History Of (Un)Natural Disasters (provisionally approved 2017-9-26)</u>
- HSCI 2346 was provisionally approved by Tom.
- The department hopes to enroll 30 to 50 students.
- It fulfills two liberal education requirements a historical perspectives core and an environmental theme. It will meet twice a week in a lecture format.
- Through this course students will learn to distinguish between primary and secondary materials and the ability to critically analyze environmental information.
- The department of Earth Science has a similar course to HSCI 2346.

- ESCI and HSCI will collaborate to resolve any conflict with course, and the committee will revisit this course at the next meeting.

#### 7. New Business

- PCAS updates are due on March 1st for the next calendar year.
- As DUGS, encourage instructors on your departments to send out mid-term alerts. For 1\*\*\* level courses, instructors are required to send these reminders. This is because students often do much better by knowing where they stand academically.
